ISLAND UPDATE

During the fall of 2014 FEMA conducted a review of the Township's Floodplain Management program and determined that numerous building and development violations have occurred primarily on the islands located within the floodway.

As a result of their initial findings, FEMA issued a formal Community Assistance Visit (CAV) report to the Township in February 2015 that stated in part as follows: "the Township must visit the islands and inventory the development that exists to date to determine a baseline of existing structures ..."

Furthermore, the report required the Township to provide compliance documentation for all violations and a timeline to mitigate those violations.

FEMA also reviewed and responded to the County's Hazard Mitigation Program and identified repetitive loss properties within the County. They listed 122 repetitive loss claims within the County of which Londonderry Township had the highest number in Dauphin County, the majority of which were on the Islands. Based on their review they mandated the Township develop a mitigation strategy for these structures.

In complying with the CAV report, the Township conducted on site reviews of Beech, Poplar, Shelley including Bare's Tip, Beshore and a small portion of Hill islands in the fall and winter of 2015 in order to document the level of development and degree of compliance or non-compliance for existing island properties.

Based on that review a number of violations involving ongoing construction activity were identified and the Township systematically began working with the residents lessees and land owners in a cooperative effort to address those issues and identify what steps are needed to bring their properties into compliance with the Floodplain Development Ordinance within timelines acceptable to FEMA.

Currently, an analysis of island properties is being prepared. Those properties that are determined to be in violation of the Township's Floodplain Development Ordinance will be required to be brought into compliance. Property owners and lessees will need to engage the services of the appropriate consultants to assist them in achieving compliance with the Floodplain Development Ordinance.


On Lot Sewage Disposal System Progress

The Township's OLSDS (On Lot Sewage Disposal System) pumping and reporting management program for District No. 3, 2015-2016 timeframe is coming to an end shortly. To date the Township has only received 51% responses to the required inspections. Please be reminded that if you have property located within Sewer District No. 3 you have only until June 30, 2016 to comply with the inspection requirements or face possible enforcement actions. The registered pumper/hauler list is available through the Township website or at the Township office if needed. Only pumper/haulers who are registered with the Township are allowed to perform this inspection.

Your septic system must be pumped and inspected at a minimum four (4) year cycles in accordance with the requirements of this program as set forth by the DEP. Failure to comply with the reporting requirements of this program will result in fines being levied against the property owners that have not provided the required information.

The next pumping and management program for District B will begin June 1, 2016 and runs until June 31, 2017.

Property Maintenance

The Township will continue conducting surveys of properties in order to determine compliance with the IPMC (International Property Maintenance Code) which regulates things such as yard and grounds maintenance, inoperable or unlicensed vehicles, building (structural) maintenance and general building repair, trash, refuse or discarded

building material accumulation, swimming pools and spas, etc. Failure to acquire required permits or properly maintain your property in accordance with the minimum requirements will lead to notice of violations, fines and/or condemnation proceedings. The Township expects voluntary cooperation from the residents for these basic maintenance

issues and welcomes the chance to talk with the residents about ways to enhance the overall appearance, function and safety of the properties within the Township.

MS4 Audit Receives High Marks

On March 10th, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) conducted an MS4 Compliance Inspection of Londonderry Township's Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) program. The intention of this inspection was to help ensure that the program is being administered properly.

The inspection report notes "It was clear from our meeting that Londonderry Township takes their MS4 program very seriously and in many cases they go above and beyond what is actually required. Overall, their plans and programs under the 6 Minimum Control Measures (MCMs) are by far the best of the handful of municipalities that I have inspected so far."

Londonderry Township has become a leader in South Central Pennsylvania relative to Storm Water Management. The newly formed MS4 and Environmental Department, led by Allison Funk, provides training and educational programs for other municipalities and the townships residents. Allison will be enhancing the township stormwater program during 2016 to meet the new DEP permit standards.

Spring Cleaning Sweeps In

Longer days, rain showers, baseball, and cleaning are just a few things that come to mind when you think about spring. And since we don't have much to say about game or weather predictions, we thought we would share some stormwater-friendly spring cleaning tips.


If you are planning any outdoor cleaning, remember to always use a broom instead of a hose to remove litter from driveways or sidewalks. Sweep litter back into your yard or into your compost pile. This prevents debris from entering a nearby creek or river. Even grass clippings and excess leaves don't belong in our streams.

Unfortunately, it is often the case that lawn care chemicals wind up washing right into local waters. There are some easy solutions to stop that from happening.

- Go natural! You may not even have to spend money on fertilizing your lawn. Mow your grass high, about 3 inches, and leave clippings on the lawn.
- If fertilization is necessary, September is the best month.
- Remember to use less. This will also help save you money, too!
- Do not apply fertilizers or pesticides within 75 feet of waterways.
- Don't apply fertilizers or pesticides when there is rain in the forecast
- Hand pick weeds when possible, and only spot treat rather than dousing the lawn.
- Try using our "Weed Be Gone" recipe:
 - o 1 gallon vinegar
 - o 2 cups Epsom salt
 - o ¼ cup dish soap

Are you planning on disposing of old paint or household cleaners? Please don't pour them out! Instead, call Dauphin County's curbside household hazardous waste program at 1-800-449-7587. This is a program available to each household for FREE, one time per year.

When poured on the ground or into an inlet, these toxins are carried by stormwater directly into a nearby creek or stream, untreated, which eventually end up in the Susquehanna River. And who wants to swim or fish with paint?




